At 6pm, not on the dot, we gather from all corners, and the girls tell of their days- the challenges and the triumphs, the funny and the frustrating. They are brave, these five city girls transplanted to this suburban area for the school year, brave to leave homes and families and friends and the familiar.

Odelia Ryan is the reigning senior this year, and she has boldly stepped into her role as the eldest. She returns to FM this fall after spending an incredible month in Spain with the Experiment in International Living Program. She loves being a senior and having her own room in the house, but also admits that the title comes with

a lot of hard work. In addition to her school work and college applications, Odelia is working a part-time job in Manlius.

Janai Fraser is the sole sophomore. She was a part of the step team last year and will continue to dance this school year as well. Janai says that it's, "A new year, a new adventure," and, like Odelia, she has been a great example for the three new freshmen who have joined the program this year.

Both Nellie Hernandez and Sara Elzeini, two of the three freshmen, come to us from the Fieldston Enrichment Program in NYC and have been best friends for years. Nellie researched the FM School before coming here and decided during her spring visit that, "It's a fun house." She is already involved with the school newspaper, having written an article about the first day of school. She is hoping to join other activities as well, particularly something athletic.

Sara has jumped right into the thick of things with a small part in the school play, *The Secret Garden*. She is the only freshman to get a role. She says that

"at the beginning it was rough being here, but it's better as time goes on and you make friends."

Deanna Starr, the third freshman, also hailing from NYC, chose to come to FM partly because her older brother is attending college forty-five minutes away, and they can visit each other now and then. Deanna, Nellie, and Sara are all hoping to be a part of the step team, captained by Odelia this year. Deanna is also thinking about trying out for a sport, though she states that "the competition is steep." She does like that there are a lot of different sports offered at FM.

It's been nine weeks since the girls left their families in the various boroughs of NYC and they have quickly made this big, old house into a warm and inviting home full of laughter and spirit. The noise level is perpetually high, unless it's study hours or curfew, and the walls of this old house are soaking in more tales of brave girls seeking a better education, a better chance.

Looking at these lovely women and listening to them showed us how much they have thrived.

Here's part of what Jenelle Berry, the alumnae spokesperson said.

"While no one will dispute that academic achievement is the number

one reason for the existence of the program, the values and life lessons that we take away from this place are far greater than scholarship alone.

The 18th Century poet, Johann Van Goethe said, "Talents are best nurtured in solitude, but character is best formed in the stormy billows of the world." There is no question, from the moment we each boarded that train or bus, at the tender age of fourteen, we demonstrated great courage and fortitude in our ability to weather the storm ahead.

Many teenagers go off to boarding school and have their own sets of experiences, but ours is so completely different. We shared an experience that is so unique that, even 10 years later, I cannot clearly articulate or fully comprehend the way in which it shaped my life.

I came into the program an only child, and I left having sisters with whom I've developed a bond built through laughter, tears, triumphs and failure. These are the women that will no doubt continue to be my best friends and confidantes.

We temporarily left our mothers and gained dozens of women and families who supported, inspired and nurtured our growth and success. We arrived wide-eyed, naïve and afraid, and left mature, discerning women ready to take on the world."

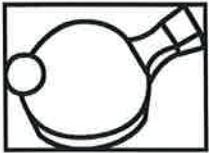
